Thanks to each of you who have taken time to register for our services on May 17th. Just as a reminder, the 10 AM service in the auditorium is not available to reserve right now. On Tuesday, May 12th, we'll open that service to registration after our graduating seniors and their families have had the opportunity to register. ### LADIES OF MY LIFE

My mom was a most remarkable lady. She demonstrated it over and over in my life, but none more so evident than on my 6th birthday. First, you must know that my mom hated baseball. Always. "Too slow!", she'd complain anytime I asked for her to play with me or to watch it. But she loved her son. She asked me what I wanted for my birthday when I was turning 6. I told her I wanted a baseball. She gave me much more than that. On May 7, 1974, she and my dad took their brand-new 6 yr old (and his two sisters, 4 and almost 2) to see the Texas Rangers play at the old Arlington Stadium. The Rangers were playing the New York Yankees. Doc Medich. Thurmon Munson. Lou Pinella. The Ranger greats – Jim Sundburg and Toby Harrah - I would know those names better later, but for that day, I was just glad to be at the game. I can still remember how incredible that day was. We ate hot dogs, peanuts, ice cream and drank Dr Pepper - all after 5 PM! Was this Heaven? It sure felt like it! Thus began a tradition. Every year, on or near my birthday (depending on the Rangers schedule), my mom would take me to see the Rangers. Finally, I got old enough to take myself and to the best of my knowledge, she never went again. But her son will never forget the great love a mother showed her son. I may have forgotten a lot of things, but not her love for me. She encouraged my studies, my work as a minister and, finally, as a pastor. She was one of two people who actually thought I could do this job I now have. The other one? Julie.

When Julie and I were planning to get married in 2000, the day we chose for our wedding was May 6. It wasn't that we WANTED to get married near my birthday. It was just that May 6th was the best day for us so we chose it. If I'm honest, when we selected that day, I was thinking, "I won't get my baseball game this year, but it's okay." But my Julie knew my tradition. When we settled on Boston for our honeymoon destination, she looked at me and smiled. She said, "Darin, are the Red Sox at home while we're there?" If I hadn't already proposed, I would've right then! Julie has not only continued the baseball tradition my mother started, but expanded it to include parks all over the US. We've been to Boston, Minnesota, LA, Seattle, Miami and San Diego. In our 20 years, we've missed only one year of being somewhere in a ballpark – 2012 when Josh was too small to travel. Her love for me sustains me, encourages me, challenges me and inspires me. I would not be here without her.

As we approach Mother's Day this weekend, make sure you take time to express your love for the ladies in your life. Tell them you love them. Tell them thanks for making so many sacrifices and showing us the love of Christ.


