I wanted to talk with you briefly about this weekend and what you might expect.

SATURDAY NIGHT at 7 PM

If you choose to join us for the concert, be aware that we will be limiting seating to 50% of our auditorium (about 450) and providing overflow in the chapel (where we can seat another 175 or so). We will restrict access to the building to our Welcome Center Doors only. Those attending will be asked to fill out a brief contact form (one per family) in the event of a virus outbreak, so we can contact you. Our Music Pastor Aaron Hodges has armbands to indicate those who will be admitted to the concert. If you do not have an armband, you will not be allowed entry. First come, first served. When the arm bands have been distributed, we've reached our capacity. I trust you'll recognize that and make plans to come early if you desire to come.

SUNDAY MORNING at 10 AM

Matthew will lead our worship time. For our preaching time, I'll be interviewing Matthew about Christ's role in his life, his passion for connecting people with Jesus through music and a new song he recently released called "Walking Miracles." As always, our services will be livestreamed, but due to copyright issues with Matthew's music, only the spoken portion will be re-broadcast. If you want to participate in Matthew's worship leading, you'll need to do so live or livestream.



AUGUST 9 – A NEW SCHEDULE AND SUNDAY SCHOOL RETURNS!

Woohoo! Sunday School returns! Promotion Sunday as well! AND we also will begin our interim schedule! To create space for our Sunday School hour, Sunday School will be 9-10 AM. Worship time will follow at 10:30 AM. Beginning August 9th, we'll begin a familiar schedule: Worship Center will host our contemporary service, the Chapel will host a traditional service and our Fellowship Hall will host a service for families. Preschool Extended Session classes (during worship) WILL NOT RETURN until further notice.

Age is a fascinating thing. When we are young, we want to be old; when we get old, we want to be young. Some are old and don't know it, some are old and try to act young, some are young and tell people they are older than they really are, and some even go so far as to acquire fake identification. Not many really act their true age. A government study revealed that birthdays correspond with age – it seems that 94% of the people who have had the most birthdays are the oldest!!. The statistics were somewhat distorted since several women participated in the study group. I knew a woman who never lied about her age – she just lied about her husband's age and said that she was 5 years younger.

Since the beginning of time, people searched for something to keep them young. Eve looked for it in an apple. In the Gospel of John, we find the story where Jesus heals a man at the Pool of Bethesda. The pool was crowded all the time with people seeking additional life. These folks were not looking to get younger; they just wanted to keep on getting older. Tales of the secret of youth have been recorded across the world for thousands of years, from biblical times to the present. Some look for it in their diet, some exercise, others have cosmetic surgery, some take to organic foods, many use makeup and some revert to drugs. The search continues with little success.

Ponce de Leon was searching for the Fountain of Youth when he traveled to what is now Florida in 1513. He did not find it, but thousands of old folks travel to Florida annually in constant search to find this treasured pool.

The hard facts of life tell us that if we live long enough, we will become old. Like it or not. Many become old while they are still young, and others stay young when reaching what some classify as old. Age may be physically measured in years, but it can also be mentally measured in thought. We are just as old as we feel and we are just as old as we think. In reality, a person is not old until regrets take the place of a dream.

There does not seem to be a problem identifying "teenagers" and "young people" but when we cross over the magic "55", we hit rough water. The 55 and 60 year

olds certainly don't want to be associated with the 85 year olds and the generation gap continues in the mature population. Divisions are now made between the "pre-old, the crossovers, the young old, the middle old, the old old and the ole geezers." This also causes a problem because chronological age does not correlate well with functional capacities. The values of each age group are somewhat different and that causes a gap of understanding and creates difficulty in the ability to communicate. So, rather than mingle with all ages, we tend to stay in our comfort zone and associate with people in our own age group. By doing so, we are missing out on many opportunities.

Some folks will not admit to being 55, but will start taking senior discounts at 40. Some 80 year olds are insulted if offered a "senior" discount but will use their AARP card liberally. It is no wonder that some want to put us in the Home just for their convenience. Some contend that age is really "Mind over Matter" – If you don't mind – it doesn't matter.

Jesus was on earth for a short 33 years – Methuselah lived 969 years and died 7 days before the flood. Of the two, who accomplished the most? We remember Methuselah for how long he lived – we remember Christ for what he did in His short period of time on earth. Life is not measured by years – it is measured by what we do with the years we are given.

There are many areas that the different age groups disagree and find little common ground. There is, however, common ground for every born again Christian, regardless of age. The playing field is level at the foot of the cross and we can all agree on that. And this should be the base of our fellowship, not the age group. Maybe we should spend less time on our differences and concentrate on the glue that holds us together. We all have a purpose, a God given talent to be used for His Glory. We may have many differences, but these differences are small compared to our common denominator found in Jesus Christ.

Regardless of your age, you are special and have a significant role in life's puzzle. If you don't know where you fit – Ask God – He knows exactly where you should be!!!

AGAPE MINISTRIES

DAVID WALL - JUAREZ, MEXICO

In the two weeks that we have been working with Mobil Manna in Times of the Pandemic, we have passed out 1,200 breakfasts to children and 900 to adults, making it a total of 2,100 people served. We have made 3,000 flour tortillas, the amount of meat has been 300 kilos (661 pounds), 2,110 bags for the food, 18 kilos



(40 pounds) of each of the following: hot peppers, tomatoes, and onions, 6 sacks of potatoes, 2,100 juices or drinks, 2,100 desserts, 8 boxes of aluminum containing 500 individual sheets each, along with condiments needed for flavor, 2,500.00 (\$112.00 US dollars) for gasoline and other small expenses. Volunteering during this work are 16 direct persons and many more working indirectly, among these are our supporters. This program has been planned to continue for two months, three days a week. When we are done we will have served 8,400 people. We will have made 12,000 tortillas and bought 720 kilos (1,587 pounds) of meat.

- Please pray for the Pastors in Juarez as they work during this COVID pandemic.
- In each bag of food, we include an evangelistic tract with the address of one of the churches closest to their home. Pray that these tracts will lead people to the Lord and that they will visit the churches in their area.
- Finally, we thank you for the many masks that were made and purchased on behalf of our ministry here. The children will now have a mask of their own to wear to help protect them from the COVID virus.
