#### **NEW DAY, NEW CHALLENGE**



To be clear, I don't blame anyone who has concerns – political or safety – about their presence here. At the same time, let's remember Jesus came for all people. My prayer is that we can seek to correct the problem of our broken immigration system but not forget Jesus loves these people too.

#### **VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL 2021**



Press Play VBS is coming June 7-10th! It will look and feel very different from any VBS we've ever done before, and we're excited about how God can use us to reach families for Christ this summer!

#### A quick overview:

- Press Play is a hybrid VBS. That means that families who aren't getting out yet can still fully participate using digital materials at home! (It also means that, unlike last year, we can still move forward with VBS even if our situation changes!)
- Each grade level will be assigned a day to be on-campus and in person! PreK/K will attend on Monday, 1st/2nd graders on Tuesday, 3rd/4th graders on Wednesday, and 5th/6th graders on Thursday. This means fewer people in the building with classes spread out to allow for safety and cleanliness.
- While on-campus, kids will engage with Bible study, worship, missions, a craft, recreation, and of course, a snack!
- On their 'at-home' days, kids and parents can access high-quality videos with Bible stories and worship songs, as well as other hands-on activities that help families learn more about what it means to follow Jesus.
- Volunteers' kids will have on-campus activities every day! That
  means that if you sign up to help, your kids get the full VBS
  experience, with special activities just for them!
- Volunteers are asked to serve all week, either in the same room with a different grade level each day, with preschoolers (volunteers' kids only, so the same group all week), as a greeter, or helping in registration! Everything will be prepared for you and the main teaching time happens in large groups, so you don't even have to teach! We just need folks to love on kids and point them to Jesus!
- We'll offer a big 'kick-off' event Sunday night prior to VBS and then an exciting Family Night with EPIC Entertainment to engage kids and parents on both ends of the week! It'll be a great way to generate some excitement and help parents understand the heart of FBC for families!

We have just experienced a tragic power failure in our state. In the blink of an eye, we were without power. We were helplessly hopeless. We had become dependent on a source of power that was not dependable. Our wellbeing and yes, even life itself was at stake. We had placed our dependence in a man-made source that was not sufficient and we suffered greatly for it.

Man-made power plants are engineered so as to have adequate backup power when and where ever needed. Power generated by power plants provide extremely high voltage in large volumes transmitted through power lines throughout our country. Some equipment such as electric powered radios, television sets and household lighting are designed to handle 110 volts, other items such as electric powered ovens require 220 volts, where large electric motors need 440 or higher voltage to operate. That power is transformed through transformers to the required voltage level to provide

us with the voltage and volume needed to do whatever we want it to do. Just a flip of the switch will instantly provide the power we need. That is, when it is available.

Our God, through the blood of the cross is our spiritual power source. God's power plant provides adequate, continuous, guaranteed power sufficient to satisfy all of our needs. Jesus Christ is our transformer and reduces the voltage so as to provide adequate power to supply our needs. Some of us cannot handle great sources of power and may be able to handle only a few volts, but others, more mature Christians can handle more. That power is regulated by our faith. Jesus used this power to raise the dead, heal the leper, made the blind see and the lame walk and cast out demons. The disciples were given power to heal the sick, cast out demons and even raise the dead. That same power is available to each one of us ONLY if we have the capacity to handle it.

There is power in the blood of Christ that was shed on the cross. All of the power in bombs, bullets, hurricanes, tornadoes and man-made power produced since the beginning of time and all that is to come is only a small amount compared to the power generated on the hill of Golgotha. The blood of the cross provides adequate power for each one of us. His power is sufficient and available all the time. With Christ, there is no power outage.

When we need man-made electrical power, we flip the switch. When we need spiritual power, we pray. If we truly believe that this spiritual power is available, then why don't we use it?
