A SIGNIFICANT STEP FOR OUR CHURCH

This Sunday evening at 5 PM in our Fellowship Hall is our monthly church conference. It's our chance to make decisions together and practice stewardship over God's resources which have been entrusted to us. This Sunday night, however, will be anything but business as usual. Throughout the life of our church, we've had a rich history of launching new churches. From the end of WWI through 2000, we were launching a new work about every 10 years. Since we launched Stonegate in the late 1990s, however, we have not done so. It's time we do so again. Only this time, in a 21st century sort of way.

For the last several years, I've been praying

for an open door for our church to start a new work on North Big Spring street, near the entrance to Midland Country Club. If you've driven that area, you know it's exploding with new growth! According to a recent demographic study, there are more than 3,500 housing units in the area between A Street and Fairgrounds Road north of Loop 250. What would it be like if we put a new FBC campus right in the middle of that? For months now, we've been working on just such a plan and – after more prayer and fasting that I think I've ever done – we're ready to present it to you for your approval this Sunday night in our church conference.

I want to be clear - this proposed campus - entitled "First Family Fellowship" - will be a satellite campus of our church, not a new church body. It will be an extension of us, just on another campus. Should you vote to approve this new work they will meet at 1201 Tejas, near the new Midland Meat Market and the Dollar General. Three Sundays of the month, their services will be a broadcast of our services, just as if they were in another part of our building. The fourth Sunday will be led by the campus pastor. You'll have to come Sunday night (or wait till next week's Banner!) to learn who that is.

As for governance and operations, the satellite campus will be under our by-laws, policies and governance to provide them with the right start.

How will we pay for this? Through the generosity of a First Family member, we have more than sufficient funds to operate this campus without touching FBC budget funds.

Lastly, this is anything but like what we did with Stonegate. We will NOT be sending big groups of people to the new campus. Frankly, there isn't room to do so. The core group of families – led by our campus pastor – will be responsible for building a church body from the ground up.

My prayer is that you'll come Sunday night having prayerfully considered this opportunity. I'll be talking about some of our history of missions in Midland and why I believe this is an important step for us.

GOD SPEAKS: DESIRES

When I was in high school, my home church (First Baptist Church, Joshua, TX) was pastored by Dr. David Hampton. He told a story of when he was struggling with God's calling on his life. A young man, he was working for the Kimberly-Clark paper goods company when he was saved and called to ministry. But he wasn't quite sure of his call. Was it REALLY God's call or did he just really WANT it to be God's call? He confided in one of his co-workers about his dilemma. The coworker responded wisely - "Could it be that your desire to preach is God's call?" David never looked back. Although he's retired now, from then until now, hardly a Sunday has passed that David hasn't preached somewhere.

This Sunday, we'll take up how God can speak through our desires. May God make his voice clear in your life today.
