VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL IS DRAWING NEAR

VBS is just around the corner – June 7-10! While this year's VBS is unlike any we've known before, my heart rejoices that we can have one at all! The decisions on how to conduct this one were made in January when COVID was still looming large over us. My prayer is that the Spirit of God will sweep through this effort, just as the Spirit of God did on the Day of Pentecost in Acts 2. There was no reason to suspect that day would be an extraordinary one. But God did it anyway! Pray with me boldly that God will do it again!

JUNE 6 WILL BE A SPECIAL DAY

One week from Sunday will be a special time! In our morning worship services, we'll begin our "Summer in Greece" study of 2 Corinthians. I've been working on this for quite some time and I can't wait to share it with you!

At 4 PM, we'll dedicate our two mission homes on Kent Street (708 and 710). We've christened them with special names we'll unveil at the dedication service (it's so secret even the honorees don't know it yet!)! After we dedicate the houses, we'll invite you to walk through them and pray for those who will come to find God's rest in those homes.

At 5 PM in our Fellowship Hall, we'll enjoy a wonderful hymn sing service! Our friend James Ervin has arranged this service for us and I'm excited about it! if you like an old-fashioned hymn sing,

From 6PM-8PM, we'll welcome a VBS Kickoff event! The north parking lot will host food trucks, a play area for children, and – most importantly – the chance to sign up your child if you haven't already done so. Even if your child isn't participating in VBS, we invite you to come share in the life of the First Family!

FIRST STEP DAY

We've provided you a summer calendar to make sure you know what your church family has planned. There's one date, however, I wanted to highlight. July 18 is a day I'm calling "First Step Day." One of the most foundational elements in spiritual growth is mile markers to help mark your spiritual path. Baptism is a supremely significant one. That's why you hear me call it the "First Step" of Christian obedience.

Would it surprise you to know we have many who have come forward to confess Christ as Savior but have never followed through with being baptized? To be clear, baptism isn't essential for salvation – look no further than the thief on the cross for evidence to that (Luke 23) – but it is a significant step in making public a declaration of a changed life.

That's why we're doing the FBC night at the Pool. This is a chance for anyone who needs to clear that part of their journey to take that First Step! I'm talking with you about it now because you may be one of those who needs to get this taken care of and I wanted to give you a chance to consider it! Sometimes people have been at church so long they're embarrassed to say they haven't been baptized! Or they don't want to be baptized on TV. This is a chance to remove barriers to people's spiritual development. Humbly, I ask that you pray with me for those who need this opportunity and that we'll embrace it whole-hearted. The last time I did this (in east Texas then), we baptized 24 that day. My friend Tommy waited 62 years. Pray with me for First Step Day and for God's work in each of our lives.

As tensions mounted between the American Colonies and the King of England, Patrick Henry stood before the Second Virginia Convention and loudly proclaimed, "Is life so dear, or peace so sweet, as to be purchased at the price of chains and slavery? Forbid it, Almighty God –I know not what course others may take; but as for me, give me liberty or give me death".

Since that day in March 1775, well over a million patriots have given their lives for freedom and liberty. They too said, "Give me Liberty or give me death". We give honor to these fellow Americans every day, but today, we give a special tribute to those who gave their all for us, for Freedom, for Liberty and for a better tomorrow. It is for us, for those of us who live, to take up their torch and defend our Republic and for the flag for which it stands.

Many words have been spoken giving tribute to those who died on the battlefield, but there can never be enough said to give adequate recognition and honor to those who gave their all for their country. General James A. Garfield, later President of the United States said in an address at the National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia, "If silence is golden, it must be here beside these graves of Americans whose lives were more significant than speech and whose death was a poem the music of which can never be sung. For love of Country they accepted death and made immortal their patriotism and virtue".

War is a terrible thing – no one really wins – everybody loses. Our young men and women leave their homes and their loved ones to defend our shores and our freedoms. They suffer pain, sickness, fear, loneliness, physical wounds and mental torment. They offered themselves as a human sacrifice – for us. I often wonder what their thoughts were when they breathed their last breath. I am sure that many were thinking of home and loved ones and were confident that those left behind would defend America just as they had. I wonder if they would be happy if they returned and found America as it is today or would they be disappointed.

On this Memorial Day, we honor those who never returned. We honor those brave men and women who never had the opportunity to enjoy the life that could have been. We give thanks to God for those who gave their all that we might have what we have today. We honor our heroic and patriotic dead by being true Americans and by faithfully fighting the battles of our day as they fought the battles of their day.
