Dear Beloved First Family



Grace and Peace in Christ our Lord! Thanks for your kindness and grace as we walk through this difficult season. As you heard me say Sunday, over the last two weeks, we've seen the Covid surge that we feared last year. I'm pleading with you to take it seriously. I'm no medical expert so I'm not endorsing any particular path. That said, the experts I have confidence in advised me to take the vaccine and I took it. I'm not saying it's a slam dunk to keep Covid at bay, but it's the choice I felt best about and still do.

What we are seeing with those in our church who have been vaccinated is that their experience is different than those who are not vaccinated. I urge you to protect yourself – vaccinated or not – by making hygiene a top priority, keeping your distance, avoid contact when you can and – if you prefer – wear a mask. These steps are no guarantee, but each of these represent a step of wisdom. This isn't meant to be political. It's just the heart of someone who loves you and your family trying to do what he can to guide us through.

One of our biggest problems was expressed well recently by my friend Dean Rippetoe: With the virus, we have medical experts playing politics and politicians claiming medical expertise. Neither really knows what's best so we'll have what we've had – overcorrections and then over-corrections the other way.

Most of all, what I ask of you is something hard to find these days. I ask you to offer grace. Please offer your pastor and our leadership grace. Please pray for us and for all of those in leadership in our city, our state and our nation. I cannot speak to this in other places, but I assure you there's no conspiracy afoot in our church. Just the hearts of shepherds trying to do our best to protect you and your family. I promise to keep you as well informed as possible to the changing winds blowing around us.

As we've seen, this situation is fluid and changing rapidly. Unless we tell you otherwise, presume our schedule will remain normal. We will do our best to keep you as well informed as possible. 

the first grade. Many people ask us if we plan to have more, and the answer is yes! Interestingly, we have a family goal to see every US national park. There are around sixty of them, and we have traveled to sixteen so far. We really enjoy being outside enjoying God's creation.
