### THE WISE MEN & THE STAR

Long before Garmin, there was a spiritual GPS system in place. It is still there and we just have to learn how to use it. We learn in Mathew, Chapter 2 about the Wise Men following a star that led them to Jesus. There has been much speculation about this event and we know only a smattering of the facts. Mathew 2.1 says, "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold there came wise men from the east of Jerusalem. The Bible does not state how many wise men or their mode of travel nor does it claim that they were kings. It is assumed that there were three because of the three gifts. It is assumed that these men were learned (wise) men and were most likely astrologers because they depended on a star to guide them. The Bible does not mention the names of the men but medieval legend names the three Kings as Melchoir, King of Arabia, who brought gold; Gaspar, King of Tarsus, who brought myrrh; and Balthazar, King of Ethiopia, who brought frankincense. These names did not appear in Christian literature until 500 years after the birth of Jesus.

The wise men came from the east following a star. They dropped by and made a courtesy call on Herod. They asked, "Where is the one who has been born King of the Jews"? This scared the wits out of Herod and he set out to find the new born baby. Herod was evidently a very insecure person because he felt threatened by a newborn baby. Maybe Herod knew more than we first thought. Herod's advisors knew the prophesy and where the Messiah was supposed to be born, but they could not find him. The star was apparently very bright and hovered over Bethlehem but Herod could not see it It seems that only those who were looking for the Christ Child for the purpose of worshiping him could see the guiding star.

The wise men were warned in a dream not to report back to Herod after they had found Jesus. Joseph was told by an angel to take Mary and Jesus to Egypt until Herod had died for their safety. Much speculation has been made about the star. Some say it was a comet, some think it was Jupiter but no one knows. If the star was so bright, why didn't everyone see it including Herod and his advisors. Did the Wise men only travel at night or did the guiding star shine during the daytime? I think the star was as bright in the daytime as it was at night and all of this was the handiwork of God. I believe the definition of a miracle is an event that cannot be explained by science. I think this fits that description.

Does it make any sense at all to say that the Light of the World is Jesus and the light that the Wise men followed was the Light of Jesus. Does it make any sense at all to say that only those looking for Jesus, for the purpose of worshiping Him, are the only ones that will see the ever-present, brilliant, guiding light of Jesus.

It is my hope this Christmas that you will find that guiding light, that you will follow it and find the Christ Child, wrapped in Love, as a gift from God.



# Giving as Worship

Here we are in the midst of our season of prayer and giving for the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions (LMCO), named for missionary Lottie Moon. The practice of giving has certainly taken a turn though the recent time of pandemic. Since my youth I've appreciated passing an offering plate during the service. Yes, in more recent times there has been the option of giving online but I was never ready to sign up for that. I needed the time of plate passing. However, in the past two years, we have learned to put our offering envelopes in a box somewhere in the building.

More than once, I've asked Dr. D, "When will we begin passing the plate as part of the worship service again." He understands both sides of the issue and I am thankful he makes decisions about such things carefully. There's no easy answer in these times of COVID, but I've missed our offertory time with the beautiful music designed to prepare our hearts for the upcoming message. It was meaningful.

For now, that time has had to be omitted.

I think of Lu Ingram. She was teaching a women's Sunday School Class a few years ago and we spent time together in Teachers Meeting on Wednesday nights. On this particular night she announced that she would be moving to live closer to her son which is not unusual in our aging group. With tears in her beautiful brown eyes, she told me that she was not going to be able to tithe in her new place because it was going to take all she had to pay the cost of the assisted living. I wasn't sure what to say, but she told me that Dr. D had reassured her that God understands those things and she shouldn't feel bad about it.

"But when I sit down and write out my check each week, it is such a beautiful time of sweet worship between me and my Heavenly Father," she said.

Wow! Those words made a major change in me. As it turned out, Lu ended up in a home of her own and now rejoices because she is able to continue giving. "As I have always told my children do the right thing and God will bless," Lu added. "We serve a loving God and you can't out give Him".

Taking time to worship as I write a check was a completely new idea to me. Our methods of giving may have changed but our response to God's Word hasn't.

Reviewing the example Lottie Moon gave helps us to draw closer to God and his Great Commission. She gave sacrificially for the people of China to know the story of Jesus. As you prayerfully consider your offering for LMCO, may it be a time of worship of our amazing, loving God.
